Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday is observed during Holy Week which is the Thursday before Easter. Maundy comes from the Latin word *mandatum* which means “commandment”. The commandment referred to is found in the gospel of John 13:34 “A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.” The gospel text for Maundy Thursday found on our church calendar, which finds its source in the Revised Common Lectionary, is always John 13:1-17, 31b-35. In this text we find Jesus celebrating the Passover with His disciples, washing their feet, and giving the commandment to love one another. Many churches hold a special service on this day which may include a Communion Service and washing of each other’s feet to commemorate Jesus’ washing of His disciples feet.

The text for this day is as follows: John 13:1-17 *Now before the feast of the passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end. And supper being ended, the devil having now put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon’s son, to betray him; Jesus knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he was come from God, and went to God; He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. After that he poureth water into a bason, and began to wash the disciples’ feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded. Then cometh he to Simon Peter: and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet? Jesus answered and said unto him, What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter. Peter saith unto him, Thou shalt never wash my feet. Jesus answered him, If I wash thee not, thou hast no part with me. Simon Peter saith unto him, Lord,*

not my feet only, but also my hands and my head. Jesus saith to him, He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all. For he knew who should betray him; therefore said he, Ye are not all clean. So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, Know ye what I have done to you? Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.

John 13:31-35 *Jesus said, Now is the Son of man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God be glorified in him, God shall also glorify him in himself, and shall straightway glorify him. Little children, yet a little while I am with you. Ye shall seek me: and as I said unto the Jews, Whither I go, ye cannot come; so now I say to you. A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.*

Although John does not record for us the institution of the Lord’s Supper we know from the other gospels that Jesus did in fact institute it on this night (Matt. 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25, and Luke 22:18-20). Jesus, who is our Passover Lamb, celebrates the Passover with His disciples and gives to them and His church the sacrament that we still partake of today.

No longer would the disciples break bread and partake of the cup in memory of the exodus out of Egypt, but rather in memory of Jesus' death and their exodus out of the wilderness of sin. We as well celebrate or commemorate this day because of the great work of our Savior which he did on our behalf. We partake of the body and blood of Jesus which is found in, with, and under the elements of bread and wine fully aware of our sinfulness and receiving what is offered in the sacrament namely the forgiveness of our sins.

Jesus on this night also did something unthinkable; He washed His disciple's feet. He who was their Master and Lord washed their feet. Peter could not understand this kind of action and recoiled at the thought of Jesus washing his feet, but as Jesus said to Peter, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with me." Peter then said "wash my hands and head as well." Jesus said "He who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean." Jesus did this to teach His disciples humility and love. Their concern was to be for the other as Jesus would demonstrate even further in His dying for them on the cross. This lesson is borne out for us today in all areas of our lives. Though we may not literally wash one another's feet we carry out this command of humility and love as we offer forgiveness to our fellow believers who are feeling the weight of their sin or perhaps have offended us in some way. We carry out this command of humility and love as we by our actions imitate the actions of Christ. We carry out this commandment of humility and love as we lay down our lives (figuratively) for the sake of others. Jesus taught His disciples that they would no longer live for themselves in this world but for the other. We are to learn the same thing as we live in this world. The most beautiful thing about Maundy Thursday is our Savior demonstrates for us that this is why He came. He came to wash us and to make us clean so that we could then live like Him in this world.

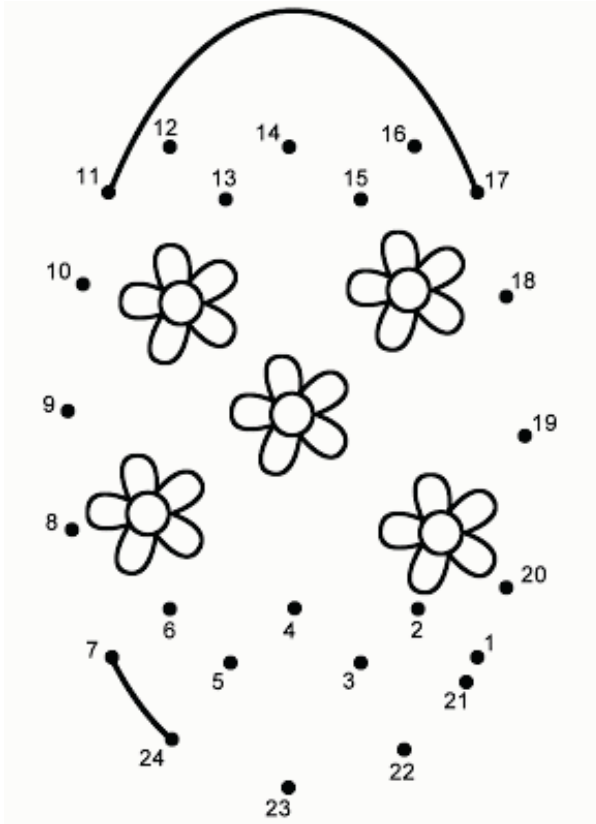
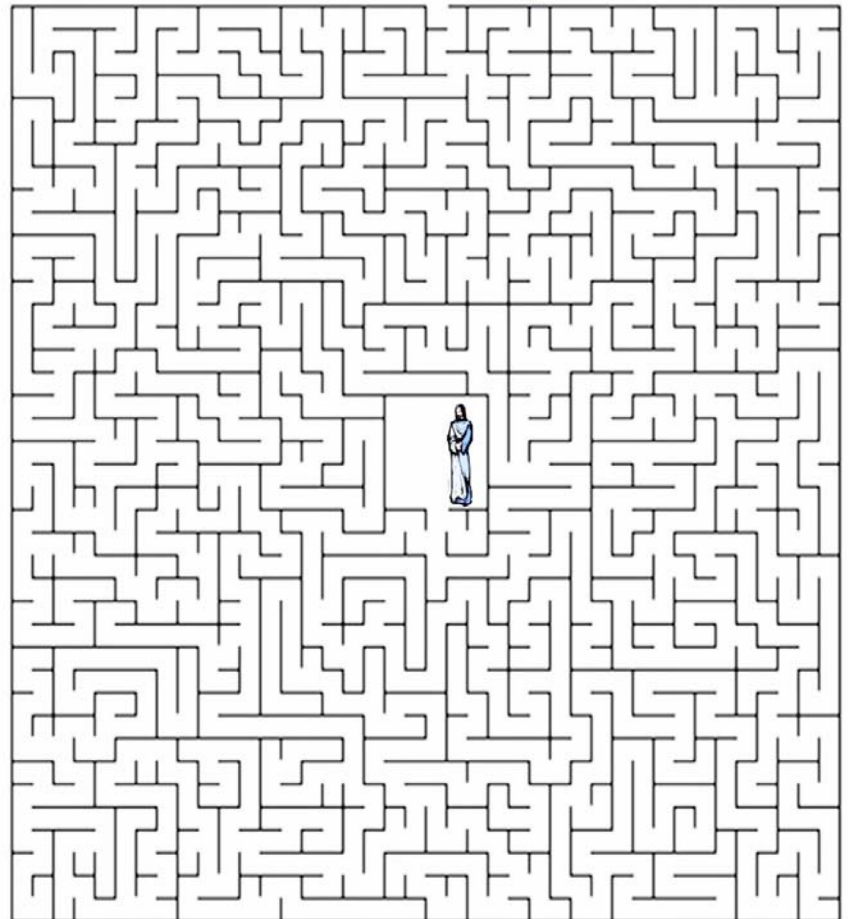

Roy Henry Yliniemi, age 84 of Menahga, MN, passed away on February 7, 2014 at the Veterans Home Village in Fergus Falls, MN.

Roy was born on March 24, 1929 to Isacki (Ike) and Aili (Haanpaa) Yliniemi on the family farm in Toad Lake Township of Becker Co., MN. As a boy, he attended the Toad Lake Country School near his home and helped on his

family's farm. As a young man, Roy ventured to Seattle, WA where he worked machine jobs during the winter months. In 1953, Roy entered the United States Army where he served for two years during the Korean War. He fondly remembered the Army's training of winter survival skills in the Mountains of Colorado. After receiving his honorable discharge in 1955, Roy worked in Minneapolis before returning to farming on the Ponsford Prairie. He was united in marriage to Hazel Mickelson from Perth, North Dakota on September 16, 1960 in East Grand Forks, MN. This union was blessed with five children: Diane, Donna, Kenneth, Anna and Anita. He and Hazel both earned their GEDs from Park Rapids High School before their children began attending school. Roy dairy farmed until 1977 and then began a career working for the Snappy-Standex Corporation in Detroit Lakes for 14 years until his retirement in 1991. Roy's life was deeply saddened by the death of his wife in 1992. In 1999, Roy moved into Menahga where he resided until June of 2013 when he moved into the Veterans Home. He enjoyed speaking Finnish with his brothers and sisters and anyone else who could speak the "heavenly" language. A most memorable experience was visiting Finland in 1991 with his wife. In his retirement, Roy kept busy doing woodwork, driving the Menahga senior center bus, reading the paper, mowing the lawn, plowing snow, and visiting family and friends.

For many years he had served as the Pine Point Township

Clerk and was active in the Minnesota Finnish American Historical Society. He was a member of the Spruce Grove Apostolic Lutheran Church near Wolf Lake and also had attended the Ponsford Community Church for many years, His family draws great comfort in knowing that Roy gave his life to Christ in the early years of his marriage and is now present with the Lord in Heaven.

He will be lovingly remembered by his five children: Diane Yliniemi of Rochester, MN, Donna Yliniemi of Menahga, Kenneth Yliniemi of Long Beach, CA, Anna (Rick) Dabill of Baxter, MN and Anita (Brent) Griffeth of Spooner, WI; five siblings: Helen Laine of Detroit Lakes, MN, Elmer (Miriam) Yliniemi, Hazel Yliniemi and Hulda (Bruce) Sannes all of Frazee, MN and Patricia (Arlan) Ervasti of Bertha, MN; his five beloved grandchildren: Ailiana, Eva and Brant Dabill and Genavieve and Spenser Griffeth; as well as numerous nieces, nephews, other relatives and many friends.

Roy was preceded in death by his wife, Hazel; his parents, his brother, James Edward Yliniemi (December 8, 2013); three siblings who died in infancy and his brother-in-law, Art Laine.

Funeral services were held on Saturday, February 15, 2014 at the Spruce Grove Apostolic Lutheran Church with Rev. Dennis Hannu and Rev. Elmer Yliniemi officiating. The organist was Deborah Aho. Soloist was Tim Mickelson singing "How Great Thou Art". Casket bearers were his nephews: Roger Yliniemi, Tim Mickelson, Davin Sannes, Isak Yliniemi, Arden Laine and Jason Ervasti. Military honors were provided by the Star of the North Marine Corps League with burial at the Pickeral Lake Cemetery near Wolf Lake.
