The Epiphany of our Lord

What is Epiphany of our Lord? Epiphany is a term that simply means a manifestation, appearance, or revelation of a deity. The epiphany of our Lord is the appearance or revelation of Jesus the Christ. It is during this season in the church year that we examine scripture texts that do exactly that. They reveal unto us Jesus Christ who is the Incarnate Deity (God in flesh). Starting from the Epiphany of our Lord (January 6) through the transfiguration of our Lord (February 19) the readings are ordered in such a way as to manifest or reveal Jesus through His teachings and or miracles He performed. He is shown in His humanity and also in His divinity, True Man and True God.

Epiphany begins with the wise men or the magi following the star to Bethlehem and worshipping the child Jesus. The baptism of our Lord is the first Sunday after Epiphany and the season ends on Transfiguration Sunday, the last Sunday in Epiphany where Jesus is literally revealed to Peter, James, and John in all of His majesty and splendor.

There are many wonderful scripture passages to examine for this time of year, but for the sake of this article we will look at the Matthew passage for the beginning of the Epiphany season. Matthew 2:1-12 Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him. When Herod the king had heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel. Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child;

and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also. When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy. And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh. And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.

The revelation of Jesus as King of the Jews to these wise men is astounding especially as we consider who these men were. They were men from east of Jerusalem, who were members of the religious hierarchy of ancient Persia and Media (modern day Iran). They were scholars and practitioners of astrology, they studied the stars (astronomy), were government officials, and were interpreters of dreams. It was because of this they were called wise men.

We may wonder how they came to know of the Jewish Messiah. It is believed that they came into contact with the Jewish religion and the Hebrew Scriptures due to the Babylonian captivity of the Jews. The Persians and Medes then captured Babylon and allowed the Jews to return to Jerusalem, but some continued to live in the Persian Empire. Daniel was also a well known man in Babylon and among the Medes. He prophesied of the coming Messiah in his book Daniel 7:13-14 I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him. And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed. Although this may explain to some degree why the wise men had knowledge of the Messiah, king of the Jews, it still does not explain how they knew to

connect the star to the birth of Jesus Christ, king of the Jews. This is what makes this an epiphany. The wise men saw the new and strange star and recognized it as a sign of the birth of a king and it was revealed to them that this was indeed the King of kings, the King of the Jews. Since God revealed to the wise men in a dream to not report the whereabouts of the child to Herod, it is possible that he revealed to them in a dream to follow the star. We may never know how they knew to follow the star, but this much we do know that God placed the star in the night sky and led them to the child and when they saw Him they were extremely happy and they fell down worshipping Him. This then is the epiphany; this child is the Messiah, the King, not just of the Jews, but also of the Gentile Magi. He is the King of the world and His kingdom is forever and will not be destroyed. May the revelation of our Lord bring you great joy this new year and let us fall down and worship Him because of His Epiphany.



Clifford Donald "Cliff" Koskela, age 82, a longtime Menahga/Wolf Lake, MN area resident, peacefully entered Heaven on Monday, January 11, 2021, surrounded by his loved ones at the Green Pine Acres Nursing Home in Menahga, MN.

Cliff was born on April 30, 1938, in Wolf Lake Township of Becker County, MN to William and Ethel (Wiirre) Koskela. He grew up learning the value of good hard work on his parent's farm near Wolf Lake. He attended the District #1712 country school near his home through the eighth grade and then went on to attend high school in Menahga. As a young man, Cliff gained employment working for Swift and Co. Turkey Processing Plant in Detroit Lakes. Later, he ventured to Minneapolis and worked at Neal's Wood Shop where he learned the skill of cabinet making. On March 3, 1962, he was united in marriage to his high school sweetheart, Irene Maninga at the Spruce Grove Apostolic Lutheran Church of Wolf Lake by Pastor George Wilson. Their marriage was blessed with four children: Davin, Tim, Stacy, and Jodi. Cliff engaged in a 53-year long career as a commercial truck driver. He drove for United Van Bus of Minneapolis, which later became Wintz Trucking. Cliff and Irene made their home in Crystal, MN where they raised their four children and lived until his retirement in the mid-1990s when they remodeled the country schoolhouse, where Irene was once a student in her childhood, into their residence where they have made their home since. In his retirement, he liked to keep himself busy and drove a truck part-time for Steve Becker and for Kirk Bettis. Cliff loved all sports and especially enjoyed following his favorite sports teams: The Vikings, Twins, and Timberwolves. He also loved

to be out in the woods hunting or out on the lake fishing. Cliff and Irene also enjoyed snowmobiling on the north wood trails. He enjoyed pulling his kids behind the family boat waterskiing or tubing. Cliff always took pride in caring for his yard and lawn. He and Irene also cared for the Midway Snurdbirds Baseball Diamond which they kept sharp for many years. Cliff was a member of the Tall Pine Tom's chapter of the National Turkey Federation and the Minnesota Finnish American Historical Society- Wolf Lake Chapter. Most of all, Cliff was a follower of Christ. His family takes great comfort in knowing what he saw through faith he is now seeing by his own eyesight in the glory of Heaven. He was a long-time member of the Spruce Grove Apostolic Lutheran Church near Wolf Lake where he loved to worship and fellowship with his church family.

He will be lovingly remembered by his precious wife for these past 59 years, Irene; his four children: Davin (Patty) Koskela and Tim (Diane) Koskela all of Maple Grove, MN, Stacy (Mike) Tadych of St. Hilaire, MN, and Jodi (Jeff) Zabler of Punta Gorda, FL; ten dearly loved grandchildren: Kristin, Joshua and Nick Koskela, Cody and Haley Belanger, Grace and Olivia Koskela and Garret, Jenna and Colleen Tadych; seven precious great-grandchildren; three brothers: LeRoy (Joan) Koskela of Wolf Lake, MN, Eugene (Geri) Koskela of Maple Grove, MN and Gerald (Deb) Koskela of Wolf Lake; and his sister, Hazel Aho of Arizona; as well as a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.

This is the last article Pastor Elmer Yliniemi wrote, which was printed in the July 2020 newsletter for a senior citizen group he attended.

Dear Friends,

I am sure we are all looking forward to resuming our regular gatherings soon. Today we live in a very uncertain and turbulent world. God is not an author of confusion or evil, but he often allows these things to call us back to Him. In ancient Israel, God persistently called His children back to Himself when they strayed by raising prophets who directed the people back to the Word of God. God has allowed circumstances throughout history, such as the political and moral climate of a nation, economic crisis, illness, war, and natural disasters to awaken people to recognize His sovereignty. Perhaps this is a time for each of us to consider our priorities in life and spend time with the Word of God. We have been living in affluent times where entertainment, sports, possessions, and money have become idols. Where is our first Love? God's Word tells us, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Matt. 6:21)

In can be easy to focus on the negative things, but the Scripture tells us to fix our eyes on "Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." The second time He will come as King of Kings to gather His own and bring judgement on the earth. Do we look forward to His second coming with Joy or fear? If our sins have been washed by the Blood of Jesus and we have a relationship with Him, we can look forward

to that day with Joy.

During these difficult times, we do not need to despair. We can trust in the hidden wisdom and power of God to lead His children even through dark times. He can bring order out of chaos. May we continue to uphold God's word and pray that by the grace of God, more people will be brought to His Kingdom through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ! We have a wonderful God who has prepared the way for us to reach our eternal home! "Behold, I send and an Angel before thee, to keep thee in the way and to bring thee into the place which I have prepared." (Ex.23:20)
