The Triumphal Entry

Matthew 21:1-11 And when they drew nigh unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of Olives, then sent Jesus two disciples, Saying unto them, Go into the village over against you, and straightway ve shall find an ass tied, and a colt with her: loose them, and bring them unto me. And if any man say ought unto you, ye shall say, The Lord hath need of them; and straightway he will send them. All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass. And the disciples went, and did as Jesus commanded them, And brought the ass, and the colt, and put on them their clothes, and they set him thereon. And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strawed them in the way. And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest. And when he was come into Jerusalem, all the city was moved, saying, Who is this? And the multitude said, This is *Jesus the prophet of Nazareth of Galilee.*

The triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem fulfilled the prophecy given by Zechariah the prophet. Jesus publicly declares Himself to be the promised Messiah as He rides into Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey. The people gathered there on that day, declare Him to be the Son of David, effectively announcing to one another that our king is here. They receive him with shouts of joy and by throwing outer garments in the roadway as well as palm branches which is another way of acknowledging that this man who rides on the colt of a donkey is their king and messiah. The praise that they shout is the word hosanna which is a word which means "please save us". They are using the words of Psalm 118 in their

shouts of praise, singing forth praise as well as a cry for deliverance from captivity. The long awaited king of the Jews had arrived and though acknowledged as such, the victory Jesus would accomplish was not what the crowds had in mind. The cries of hosanna would soon become cries of crucify him, crucify him, and in His Crucifixion their request would be granted. His death and resurrection are the reasons for this ride into Jerusalem. The cry of the crowds gathered that day were accurate, this man riding on the back of a beast of burden was none other than the Son of David, their long awaited Messiah who would in fact deliver them and become their salvation. It would be an eternal salvation and not an earthly one. The prophet from Nazareth was indeed the Son of God or as John describes him. The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

The words that crowd cried out we still use today in our communion service as we celebrate the Sacrament of the Altar: Hosanna in the Highest! Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the Highest! We confess in the reciting of these words the glorious nature of what we are about to partake in. In Holy Communion our Lord comes to us and feeds us with His own body and blood, the Holy One comes and feeds those who are made holy in order to bring to us peace. Jesus the Messiah has made us holy and this is what we celebrate in the Eucharist. "Hosanna in the Highest" or "Lord, save us! Lord, please grant us success(HCSB)! And He has granted us eternal success for our sins are forgiven and we are made holy. When we gather around the communion rail on the 1st Sunday of the month, may these words bring us complete joy as we remember the glorious victory that was accomplished for us in Jesus' triumphal ride into Jerusalem.

Funeral



Linda Paananen was born to Julius and Selma (Sallinen) Paananen at home in Paddock Township in Otter Tail County, Minnesota. She passed away peacefully at home at 95 years of age.

Linda was the sixth child in a family of eight. Having five brothers older than her, she often stated she was a tomboy doing the same things her brothers did. She attended the one room country schoolhouse that was a mile from home. When Linda was 8 years old, her brother accidentally shot Elmer, her 13 year old brother and she never liked to hear gun shots after that experience. About a year later another brother, Melvin died from a ruptured appendix at the age of 13. Mom always said she grew up in a loving home and had great respect for her parents. On December 23, 1942, Linda was united in marriage to Raphael Aurelius Aho. To this marriage 20 children were born, 12 sons and 8 daughters. The last two sons were stillborn. The couple spent their first eight years living on the Aho Brothers Farm in Wolf Lake, MN. In 1950 they purchased Linda's home place where they farmed together for more than 40 years. To help make ends meet, Linda worked at the Swift Turkey plant in Detroit Lakes for 16 years. Linda was a very loving mother who made tasty meals, delicious flatbread and pies. She sewed hundreds of quilts and enjoyed going to garage sales. One never left hungry from their home and she knew how to rock crying babies to sleep. Linda enjoyed putting puzzles together and she would read her Bible daily and pray for each of her children by name.

Linda was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, two sons in infancy, William and Matthew, two grandchildren, Jeffrey and Ruth Aho; five brothers: Ernest (Hilda), Reino (Lillian), Elmer, Melvin, Alvin (Elaine) Paananen. One sister: Esther (Reuben) Hendrickson, Brother-in-laws: Uno, Urho (Emmi), Toivo, Arvo, Hugo (Elsie), Paul and Joel. Sister-in-laws: Helmi, Anna, Alli Aho, Ilma (Art) Suomala, and Rauha Aho.
